### Junior Sailing Program

For more than 50 years the Agamenticus Yacht Club has taught youngsters the basics of sailing, seamanship and safe conduct on the water. The AYC Junior Sailing Program focuses on safety, enjoyment and knowledge of sailing. Classes include instruction on water safety, rowing, knot tying, nautical rules and terms and sailboat rigging. Racing activities and occasional field trips add variety and excitement to the program.



### Staff

AYC has a highly trained staff of US Sailing Certified Instructors. The staff is sensitive to each child's needs and promotes respect for the water and a love for sailing. Class size is limited, coached and supervised by multiple instructors, assuring both safety and fun.

### Fleet

AYC has five classes of sailboats, several recreational kayaks, and two rowboats available to students and our adult members. Beginners learn to sail in our Optimist Dinghies; safe, dry and simple sailing prams ideal for teaching new sailors. Intermediate Sailors also use the Optimists, then move up to our JY-15's when ready for double-handed sailing. Advanced sailors have access to the JY-15's as well, but also hone their skills in our Club 420's, our Lasers, and our J-22's.

### Racing Team

Racing Team instruction is designed for junior sailors with sailing ability at the intermediate or advanced levels. Instructional content focuses on the development of skills necessary for competitive racing. Shore-based classroom instruction and on-the-water practice drills focus on race tactics, maneuvers and strategy.

## Season

AYC will be open beginning June 25th through the Labor Day weekend. In addition, the club will remain open on weekends through September 11th.

## Hours

The clubhouse is open Monday through Friday 9:00 AM- 6:00 PM, Saturday and Sunday 10:00 AM-6:00 PM.

## Sailing Classes

The AYC Sailing Program is for children ages 8 to 18. All students must demonstrate swimming competency and have their own Coast Guard approved type III life jacket. Instruction takes place in York Harbor, on the York River and in adjacent ocean waters. Two Four-Week sessions are offered and many students choose to enroll for the Full Summer at a discounted rate. Final class assignment is determined by the club and is based upon age, ability, and available space in the desired class. Our program fills up quickly, so act today.

### CLIPPERS (AGES 8 to 10)

Beginning sailors learn about and become comfortable with boats. The curriculum includes learning fundamental nautical terms, parts of the boat, rigging, finding wind direction, learning to steer with a tiller, water safety, knot tying and an introduction to local harbor knowledge.

### SCHOONERS: (AGES 9 to 11)

For young sailors who may have some previous sailing experience. The curriculum allows sailors to further develop their understanding of the river and ocean while improving their sailing and kayaking fundamentals including rigging, boat handling, docking, points of sail, reading the weather, seamanship and water safety.

### CUTTERS (AGES 10 to 12)

This class is designed for intermediate sailors who want to refine their sailing skills. Curriculum builds on the fundamentals learned in the Clipper and Schooner classes, but focuses on sailing in more conditions and points of sail. This class allows sailors to gain skipper and crew experience in double handed boats.

### GALLEONS (AGES 12 to 15)

This class is for sailors who are interested in learning a range of sailing skills including: introduction to navigation, rules of the road, anchoring, mooring and docking techniques, knot tying and splicing. The Galleons class will sail a variety of boats. The Galleons class is for those sailors that want to continue to expand their sailing skills.

## Racing Teams

All Racing Team programs include: Racing Safety – Racing Terminology - Rules of Racing - Sail Trim and Boat Handling for Speed - Starting Tactics - Mark Rounding Strategies - Roll Tacking - Spinnaker Handling - Competitive Spirit and Team Play - Inter-club Regattas.

### OPTIMIST RACING TEAM: (AGES 10-15)

Our Optimist Race Team is designed for intermediate or above sailors with a maximum recommended weight of 110 pounds. For increased skill development, Opti Race Team members are encouraged to combine Opti Race Team enrollment with sailing class instruction.

### 420/LASER RACING TEAM: (AGES 13-18)

Our 420/Laser Race Team is for the older and more experienced sailor. A minimum weight of 110 pounds is recommended.

Both Opti and 420/Laser Race Team members will additionally participate, on a rotating basis, in MIRC interclub racing each Wednesday in July and part of August. The team will also race in a number of regional regattas.

### ACCESS to our EXTENSIVE FLEET of BOATS

We have a variety of boats for your use and enjoyment: Optimist Dinghies, Lasers, JY-15's, Club 420's, J-22's, rowing dinghies, recreational kayaks, and a canoe. Please make arrangements with the staff for scheduling the use of these various craft.

### ADULT SAILING LESSONS

It's never too late to learn the pleasures and challenges of being at the helm of your own boat. Our club offers private lessons by appointment for both individual and small groups of adult students and host adult sailing clinics periodically throughout the summer, for groups of up to eight adults. ### HARBOR ACCESS

AYC provides rack storage for a modest fee, on our docks for your personal kayak, canoe, rowing shell or Laser. There is also some dock space available for up to 15' boats, and a wait list is maintained by our Dock Master. Please contact him for current availability. Unfortunately, AYC does not have guest moorings available, but there are ones maintained by the Town of York. If you keep a boat of your own on a mooring in the harbor, you may use our floats for loading of gear and passengers. You may also wash down your vessel at our floats, or tie up your dinghy for a couple of hours for a jaunt into town for lunch.
